Pick some academic topic that interests you. Find at least five articles pertaining to the topic. Write a couple paragraphs using those articles as sources, citing the articles where relevant. Have a figure - take one from one of the articles if you want. Include a bibliography using the `cite` package.

## Things to Remember

- The `\bibliography` command takes two required arguments - the first is the name of the `.bib` file (without extension), the other may be left blank.
- The bibliography will not typeset unless the `\bibliographystyle` command is given. It has a required argument, the simplest of which is `plain`.
- If you want citations to be superscripts, use `[superscript,biblabe1]` as the optional argument when initializing the `cite` package.
- `scholar.google.com` has an "Import into BibTeX" option when you click "cite."
- The `.bib` file doesn't typeset; it is an external reference file. To get your document to typeset everything, run it through:
  1. pdfLaTeX
  2. BibTeX
  3. pdfLaTeX
  4. pdfLaTeX

Turn in both the `.tex` file and the `.bib` file.
